Research Project on the Romanesque Stucco Fragments from the UNESCO World Heritage Church of St Michaels in Hildesheim

Since October, Silja Walz M.A. has been working on the summary documentation and research of all stucco fragments, which have now been united for the first time. The first realisation was that their number is higher, namely 250 instead of 200. New observations regarding the work process and the polychromy have also been made. External experts are supporting the team. The next step is the non-invasive investigation involving a portable X-ray fluorescence spectroscopy by Prof. Dr. Stefan Laue and IR/UV recordings of relevant fragments by Prof. Dr. Barbara Beckett. Together with the project partners, a conference at the HAWK in Hildesheim is planned for 2024.

The Hornemann Institute aims to contribute its subjectspecific online research data portals (hericare, saltwiki, E-Publications) and restoration thesauri EwaGlos.

A new feature is that we will now offer one or two online consultation hours for some courses, in which an author will answer questions about the course materials. The new online course "Mould and Records" developed by Friederike Johanna Nithack M.A. met with great interest: The German version of the course was booked by 38 colleagues, the evaluation was unanimously positive and showed no need for change. Therefore, the course has been translated into English. Conference Volume in Preparation

The volume of our conference 850 Years of St. Godehard in Hildesheim, which took place at the HAWK in Hildesheim from 19 to 21 September 2022, is almost finished and will soon appear in print.

For the first time, the conference took an interdisciplinary approach to the history of the church and its significant historical furnishings over the centuries, focusing on four main areas:

- The foundation of the monastery and the building of the church in the 12th century

- the alterations to the church and monastery in the course of the reforms in the 15th century

- the furnishing of the church in the Baroque period - and the historicist redesign in the 19th century.
