The National Research Data Infrastructure (NFDI), which is currently being established, promotes the exchange of research data by harmonising terminologies and developing common metadata standards. We invite conservators from all fields to participate in the community cluster 'Conservation and Restoration/ Conservation Science' and the working groups (TWGs) 'Analysis of the RDM landscape in the field of conservation and maintenance of cultural heritage' and 'Community standards for controlled vocabularies and exchange formats in the field of conservation and maintenance of cultural heritage'. The Hornemann Institute is developing an online course on research data management in conservation and restoration as part of the NFDI.

It will be an introductory online course on handling digital data and data formats.

The course will be free of charge for self-learners.
