

Why Open Access?

The main advantage of making research available through Open Access is that Open Access articles are far more widely read and therefore your work and results are made more broadly visible. This supports your reputation and that of your institution. Open Access articles achieve citation rates that are up to three times higher than traditional printing because they are immediately available to scholars, scientists, students and the public worldwide. They can be accessed easily from any workplace with an internet connection. Because the materials are not subject to space limitations, all of the information, arguments and proofs that are wanted can be shared.

Open Access promotes international cooperation and with it, the process of conducting research. Our authors receive a large amount of feedback if they provide their contact.

Worldwide collaboration is becoming increasingly important, particularly in the small but highly interdisciplinary field of conservation-restoration. Highly esteemed institutions, including the Getty Conservation Institute in Los Angeles and the International Institute for Conservation of Historic and Artistic Works (IIC) in London, are supporting the fight against „grey literature“.



