We categorise the publications on our website into:

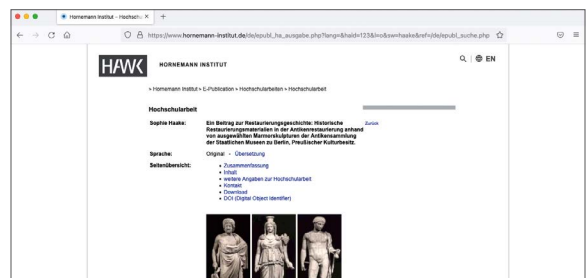
- Essays

Copyrights must be observed for electronic publications in the same way as for print publications. This means that you may have to obtain rights of use for illustrations, and others must respect your copyrights.

With us, your personal user ID gives you unrestricted access to the data published under your name, and you can update or delete it, whenever it suits you. You can also make further publications of your work at any time.

We Provide You with a Persistent Identifier

At your request, we can provide your electronic texts and images with persistent identifiers (DOIs). This makes your net publications permanently and worldwide unambiguously citable and also accepted as source references.



Cooperation with Publishers

Many publishers or editors of conference proceedings now allow their authors to make their contributions available for download free of charge, either immediately or after a protection period, see <https://v2.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/>

Protected by Copyright

Open Access documents are of course protected by copyright in the same way as conventional publications. The exploitation rights remain with our authors.

Open Access and the Hornemann Institute

Open Access means that scientific literature is available free of charge and publicly on the internet. At the same time, the provider should leave the authors control over their work and guarantee the right to have their work appropriately acknowledged and cited.
